OUR PILLARS

RECOGNITION

The MDTP brings families, businesses, and schools together to turn teacher recognition into a year-round, sustained effort. We do this by creating cost effective solutions that involve the community in recognizing teachers statewide at a higher, more frequent level both inside and outside the classroom.

SUPPORT

By rethinking how teachers are recruited, trained, and retained, we can solve issues that prevent them from doing their best work. We engage partners from early childhood to post-secondary levels and seek to create a teacher pipeline that will attract talented people to the classroom.

COMPENSATION

We're exploring how we can develop technology, products, and services that can be used to generate NEW streams of revenue for the education system that are not tied to state funding, property taxes, or tax credits—which can be used to increase teacher salaries.





EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REFLECTION

“Teachers should be a student’s FIRST example of success”.

To quote 2pac Shakur, “Last year was a hard one, but life goes on....” What a year we had. It was full of obstacles, trials, tribulations and.....opportunities. The world remained shut down, and we encountered our first school year that was largely conducted virtually for most students. Wearing masks and choosing to get vaccinated, or not, weren’t the only things we had to navigate. We also had to adjust our approach to work and delivering programs in a virtual/remote working world. We had to consider things that we never thought we would even have to consider. But this is where the opportunities, in a very challenging moment, presented themselves.

We first had to look at how would we continue celebrating and recognizing teachers if schools were closed. This led to our first ever, socially distanced, Take a Teacher to Lunch celebration. Unfortunately, we couldn’t gather to eat, play games and socialize as we traditionally would. So, we opted to deliver individually packaged lunches with our partners to teachers’ classrooms, where teachers could also stop by and pick up a packaged lunch from one of our partner restaurants and take them back to their classrooms. All, with masks on, of course.

We also launched a podcast series called The Teacher’s Lounge where we interviewed teachers via Zoom to give people a peek behind the curtain of what teachers were experiencing during the pandemic. We created virtual internships and recruited volunteers and interns to assist teachers in their virtual classrooms and beyond. We hosted our Teacher Tree classroom supply drive and did our annual fundraising events virtually. We stayed active and definitely got creative, to say the least, and learned some better ways to do things and expand our programs to new areas that we hadn’t considered prior to the pandemic.

We were able to create new partnerships and secure funding that is going to aid us in expanding our programming. This past year has been a reminder to us of the power of community - how we can overcome mighty obstacles by working together. We hope society remembers these lessons as we work towards creating a more equitable future for our children. I know we at MDTP will. We sincerely thank everyone who supported our work and continues to stay engaged with our mission. Without you, we are not possible. We will continue to get up every day and dream of bigger, better and sustainable ways to do more for teachers so they can turn around and do more for students. Our children deserve it.

CLASSROOM SUPPORT TEAM

With the pandemic in full swing, we had to scale back our CST program to all virtual. We had 6 interns helping out 6 teachers for Hurley Ranch elementary in Tolleson. Also, because of the pandemic and shifting priorities the CST program, this year, ran from January to May. Another small change we made was cross training the interns to perform each CST position: Student Teacher, Teaching Assistant, Parent Engagement and Technology Specialist working under the direction of the teacher which we will continue moving forward. Despite these setbacks the program was a success. Teachers got back 1327 hours of free time back and all the CST interns felt they gained the tools to become a better teacher. Hurley Ranch saved nearly \$43,000 in costs having the CST and related administrative costs.



TITLE I TECH PROGRAM

As the pandemic hit last year, schools were forced to go online. Many students attending Title I schools found themselves disconnected to their classrooms because they lacked a device and/or internet service. MDTP, in partnership with Iheart Radio, Mix 96.9 and Mathew & Priscilla in the Morning, launched the Title I Tech program with a #Continuethelarning campaign to bring devices to students in need, which received community support in terms of donated devices and financial donations. Even though the pandemic is waning, the need is still there and we're determined to keep Title I Tech going. This year we gave away nearly 500 devices and collected \$50,000 in financial and in kind donations.



PASS THE APPLE/FLAT STANLEY

We started our social media-driven [#passtheapple](#) campaign giving teacher fans an opportunity to use social media to thank their favorite teachers for the spectacular work they do. But this year, we added a creative twist. MDTP is doing our own take on Flat Stanley with our beloved mascot Benjamin.
